Class Disclosure

GOAL - To provide a unique and enjoyable educational experience through learning, understanding, and PERFORMING music in a concert band setting.

INSTRUMENTS - All students will need an instrument and supplies. Check below to see when you need to have these instruments for class. It is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that you use good quality instruments. Don't go for the sweet deal on ebay or Amazon! They tend to not play as well, they break easier, and they usually end up costing more in the end. A list of some [recommended brands](#) is found on the band website and is also attached to this disclosure. The supplies needed depend on the instrument you are playing:

Flute – Cleaning rod and cloth.	Clarinet and Saxophone – At least two reeds (four or more is recommended) AT ALL TIMES, cleaning cloth, cork grease.
Brass (<i>Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Baritone, Tuba</i>) – At least one bottle of valve oil (slide oil/cream for trombones) and tuning slide grease.	Percussion – Percussion kit consisting of: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• At least one pair of Snare Sticks• At least one pair of Mallets• Practice Pad• Bell Set

It is **strongly** suggested that students acquire their own instruments, by either using one you already own, or renting/purchasing from one of the local stores! If you cannot do this, there are school instruments available - with the exception of alto saxes - for a rental fee of \$95 for the year. Quantities of these are limited, however, and we need to reserve these instruments for those who cannot acquire their own. If you have questions, or difficulty acquiring an instrument, please see Mr. McGary.

Beginning Band & Percussion Students – We'll take the first week or so in class to introduce the various instruments, and go over class information, music basics, etc. Students will then select the instrument that they wish to play for the year. Students can start bringing instruments on **Monday, August 22nd**, and we'd like to have them all with instruments no later than **Monday, August 29th**!

Intermediate Band Students – Students can start bringing instruments on **Monday, August 15th**, and we'd like to have them all with instruments no later than **Wednesday, August 17th**!

*Instrument lockers will be assigned at the beginning of the year. If you wish to use a lock, you must provide your own and it must be a combination lock!

MUSIC - We will be using Essential Elements Interactive as our method book this year - Book 1 for beginners, Book 2 for 2nd year students. The school will provide each student with the book. We will pass out folders, and sheet music in class throughout the year. These will be the responsibility of the students to take care of. They will be required to turn in sheet music after performances.

GRADING - The grading in band reflects how proficient the student is on their instrumental skills, music reading knowledge, and evaluation skills. It also measures the level of effort and accountability the student shows in class and in home practice on their instrument. The grade is based on the following areas each quarter: Participation, Practice, Playing Tests, Written Quizzes, Assignments, Performances.

CLASS RULES

- 4th offense – Reflection of offense: Think Sheet, parents contacted, possible office referral.

The following technologies will be used in class for various assignments, tasks, and performances throughout the year. Please read through each section carefully.

1. **Online/Software:** We will be using several software programs, many of which require the students to create an account, for different assignments in class. The following are programs we will be using for sure:

Student names, or any information linking them to a photo or video, will NEVER be used. ***Please check the “Yes” box on the agreement page to give permission for pictures or video of your student to appear on the website.*** If you check the “No” box, I will not post any pictures or video which contain close-up shots of your student in them.
3. **In-Class Media:** Throughout the year, we will be showing various movie, video, & other media clips in class to enhance and explain concepts we are learning. These clips may come from sources like YouTube, DVDs, or other approved sources. They will ALWAYS be school appropriate, approved through the school or district. If a movie is shown it will be rated G or PG. ***Please check the “Yes” box on the agreement page to give your child permission to view these movie/video clips in class.*** If you have a concern or question with this, please contact Mr. McGary.
